Marking Score Sheets

A penalty may be applied every time a score sheet is returned in this way. I have refrained from penalizing teams for this violation but have been informed by the Board to start to issue penalty points in the coming seasons for consistent violations.

Basic Rule

The **Home** teams score sheet will be used to determining the result of the match. (CVDA Rules of Play - Section IV- Reporting Results - Paragraph C) Therefore it is imperative that **both** teams agree that the score is correct and that the “Marks”, “Outs” and “Legs played” correlate to each score sheet.

Score Sheet

1. Make sure the First & Last name of each the player is entered in the appropriate column.
(and is spelled correctly)

2. Complete the Division, Date and Night boxes at the bottom of the sheet.
3. Players get 2 (two) slashes for a 5,6,7,8, or 9 mark hit in the 01 game and a single (one) slash for a 5,6,7,8 or 9 mark in a Cricket game (including bulls).
4. A single (one) slash is given to the player who “takes the game out”. (Out Shot)
5. At the end of the match the Captain (or designated scorekeeper) should compare their sheet with their opponents sheet and each clearly total the number of marks, out and legs played by each player. (Preferably circling a number in each column)

6. Once the accuracy of the score sheets have been agreed by both teams the Captains need to sign the appropriate signature boxes and ensure any special instructions have been shown in the Notes box. (I.e. 9 marks, 180's, 6 Bulls, High In, High Out's, Captain change, Captain address or Telephone number change etc.)
7. Finally ensure the top (white) copy of your score sheet is given to the Home captain and then placed into the drop boxes provided at the Sponsors location. You retain the yellow copy of the score sheet for your records.
